
2020 Model Train and Garden Show: Attack of the Giant Monsters! 2

Attack of the Giant Monsters 2 is the exciting sequel to our first giant-monster themed model train show in 2016. The first show was cut short (due to the Domes closure), but the monsters have returned, and they are bigger and better! Our G-scale model train garden will feature spoofs of your favorite classic giant movie monsters. Visitors will travel the tracks through a not-so-scary but very silly set of cities under attack, creatures lurking in the plants, and plenty of hidden surprises.

The garden will include miniature topiary azaleas and other varieties of dwarf evergreen trees. Among many varieties of flowering annuals, this show will also showcase a unique eyeball looking plant called *Acmella oleracea* and a carnivorous plant display to complement this show's Monster theme.

The show runs from January 18 through March 29.







Where Ecology Meets Economy

Thanks to the generous sponsorship of the Friends of the Domes, I was able to attend Where Ecology Meets Economy, a local conference on native plants, sustainable landscaping, and other pressing environmental issues related to horticulture. This well-attended gathering of green-industry professionals was hosted by Boerner Botanical Gardens and featured two extensive talks by Doug Tallamy. As an entomologist, Dr. Tallamy has conducted numerous studies concerning native insects, specifically the link between caterpillar and bird populations. He stressed the importance of using native plants

in our landscaping whenever possible to help support local insects, which

have specifically adapted to feed on them. Without an abundance of insect life, most of the birds we know and love would not be able to feed their young, and ecosystems all around us would start collapsing. As Dr. Tallamy put it, "Insects are the currency of our ecological bank account." There was a break for lunch, followed by a panel discussion that included horticulture professionals

as well as native plant experts. Later in the afternoon, different guided tours were offered around the botanical gardens. All in all, it was an impressive day of education and networking. I left feeling energized to continue working on the different outdoor beds at the Domes, which all act as vital pollinator and insect habitat. I am hopeful that in the future we can expand our garden footprint and add even more beauty and habitat to the park.

A simple way we can all make a difference is to choose native species when planning out outdoor spaces. Wisconsin birds thrive on native insects who thrive on native plants!

A great resource for finding native plant species that support native insects and therefore native birds is www.audobon.com. You can enter your zip code and view a list of plants native to your area and the birds they will support.

Another great resource, also available online, is a PDF by Mariette Nowak and the Wisconsin Society for Ornithology. Search the term **Beyond the Bird Feeder Booklet** to find this excellent resource, specific to Wisconsin birds and plant species.
