



# **VENUS FLYTRAP FLIP BOOK INSTRUCTIONS**






1. Print the flip book.  
Card stock is recommended.



2. Use colored paper or white and color.




3. Use crayons, colored pencils or markers to decorate each picture.



4. With adult supervision, cut out each numbered piece on the black lines.



5. Stack the pieces in order from 1 to 30, with #1 on top.



6. Staple the top of the stack.



7. Hold the stack in your left hand with the stapled end between your thumb & fingers.



8. Grasp the opposite end with your thumb on the top edge & your first two fingers underneath.



9. Holding the booklet in this way, turn your left hand fingertips facing up.




10. Hold the end of the book in your right hand with your fingertips facing the back of your left hands fingers.




11. With your right hand slowly releasing pressure, allow the pages to flip up one at a time.



12. Increase your speed as you go.



13. Watch your Venus Fly Trap...

15. ...eat that pesky fly!




16. Repeat and enjoy!

DID YOU KNOW...

The Venus Flytrap makes its own food through photosynthesis like other green plants.



The Venus flytrap eats bugs to provide nutrients that it doesn't get from the poor soil it grows in.

Carolinas in  
the US.



For the flytrap to  
close, the prey  
must touch the  
small stiff  
trigger hairs two  
times to set the  
trap!
