FOR THE LOVE OF NATURE

Ideas for Small Space Gardening

🔪 ardens can take many forms, from expansive plantings to a single patio pot. You don't need a huge space to grow a variety of plants. All you need is imagination and an interest in gardening.

Containers are a great way to display many types of plants in combination. Group a few pots of varied sizes to provide visual interest, with taller pots in the back. Just make sure to be intentional about your container selection. Creating a grouping with too many different container styles or colors will take the attention away from the plants.


When choosing plants, annuals add dependable, season-long color to container gardens. Perennial flowers and grasses, herbs, vegetables, and even small shrubs and dwarf conifers add color and height.

Tips for selecting plants:

• To keep perennial and woody plants in pots yearround, select species two hardiness zones lower than yours. Most of southeast Wisconsin is zone 5b, so choose plants that are hardy to zone 3b or lower.

 To incorporate vegetables, select compact varieties or those specifically bred for container growing. 'Tom Thumb' is a common cultivar name for smaller plant selections.







Herbs in pots are compact, easy and useful. If you have space for bigger pots, combine herbs with other flowers or vegetables. As you get more creative and have a better understanding of the amount of light and availability of water in your space, you may want to explore options for vertical gardening.
